STATEMENT FROM THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY, INVESTMENT & COMMERCE REGARDING ADVERTISEMENTS FROM THE SCRAP METAL

FEDERATION OF JAMAICA

The Ministry of Industry, Investment & Commerce notes with concern the innuendos

made by the Scrap Metal Federation of Jamaica in an advertisement published in the

Observer of Friday, July 29th.

The Ministry notes in particular the Federation's statement: "Today fi mi ... Tomorrow

fi yu!" and while this could have different interpretations, it is necessary for the

Federation to clarify what exactly is meant by this statement, as persons reading the

advertisement could interpret it as a personal threat.

The Ministry also notes the allegation being made concerning corrupt public officials and

urges the Federation to provide any such information to the police. We also wish to

state, unequivocally, that the Ministry has no hidden agenda concerning the scrap metal

trade as implied by the Scrap Metal Federation in one of its advertisements.

The fact remains that the indefinite closure of the scrap metal trade resulted from

rampant and escalating theft of metal, causing the loss of millions of dollars and the

destruction of our infrastructure over the past years. The Federation mentions the good

suffering for the bad owing to the closure of the trade, but the Government has taken the

decision that it cannot allow one industry to exist at the expense of others. Members of

the Federation have also failed in self-regulation of the industry.
